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## APPLICATION FOR HISTORIC USE PERMIT

(Deadline for Submission: Extended until November 1, 2019)

This form may be submitted in person, by mail or e-mail, or by fax.

An application for a Historic Use Permit must be accompanied by an application for well registration if a valid registration is not currently in place. Historic users requesting authorization to produce more groundwater annually than designated as the Maximum Historic Use of the well or well system must submit an application for an Operating Permit for such an increase in production. Please consult District staff on what authorizations are required for your specific situation. The District recommends applicants schedule a pre-application meeting with District staff prior to final submission of a permit application.

#### IV. VERIFICATION PERIOD

- (a) If the well for which you are applying for a Historic Use Permit was not required to be metered by the District prior to January 1, 2019, or if at least two (2) full calendar years of metered records of groundwater production during the existing and historic use period do not exist, you must commence a two (2) year Verification Period, as defined by District Rule 1.1 (January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2021).
- (b) The Verification Period process and eligibility for a Historic Use Permit also apply to you if:
  - (1) You had beneficial use of the water during the existing and historic use period, but because your activities have not been commenced and in operation for the full calendar year of the existing and historic use period, you do not have beneficial use for a full calendar year; and
  - (2) You received an approved well registration from the District prior to January 1, 2019, that is still valid, but the registered well had not yet been drilled and completed on January 1, 2019, but only if the well has been drilled, completed, and equipped with a meter on or before December 31, 2019.
- (c) For approved well registrations or well registration applications deemed to be administratively complete prior to the effective date of these rules, but for which no groundwater has yet been produced, the Board may authorize the two (2) year Verification Period to begin the first calendar year after production begins.
- (d) If your well does not already have an approved well registration from the District, you must submit an administratively complete well registration application to the District no later than March 1, 2019, in addition to submitting an administratively complete application for a Historic Use Permit to the District no later than November 1, 2019. Upon completion of the Verification Period, you must provide as part of the application the annual groundwater production history of the well for each year of the two-year Verification Period.
- (e) You must amend the Historic Use Permit application for the well or well system during the Verification Period or at any time prior to February 1, 2022, if necessary, to include any new information or to update information that you have determined to be inaccurate or incorrect.
- (f) For a well that was registered and required to comply with the metering, fees, and reporting requirements prior to January 1, 2019, compliance with such requirements is not suspended and shall continue during the Verification Period.
- (g) Production of groundwater during the Verification Period shall not itself be eligible for a claim of Maximum Historic Use from the well, but rather is intended as relevant information to assist you in determining what the Maximum Historic Use of the well was during the existing and historic use period.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS (a) During the time between January 1, 2020, and the issuance or denial of the Historic Use Permit, you may annually produce no more than the amount of groundwater specified in the application or most recent amendment thereto, as the Maximum Historic Use, and must pay the water use fees as set forth in District Rule 7.1. This interim authorization is based on the information included in your Historic Use Permit application, or most recent amendment thereto, and constitutes your permit to operate and produce groundwater from the well identified in the application until the Board acts on the application. (b) You must amend your application to include any new information or to update information that you have determined to be inaccurate or incorrect on or before January 1, 2020 (prior to February 1, 2022, if subject to Verification Period).

the Maximum Historic Use for that well or well system in the application or most recent amendment thereto, you will be subject to enforcement for violation of the District rules, unless you are authorized under an Operating Permit to produce the additional groundwater from the well or well system.

- (d) In the interest of promoting conservation of groundwater, the District will allow you to apply for a Historic Use Permit that authorizes an amount less than your Maximum Historic Use. However, you will forfeit your right to make any future claim or application to the District for a Historic Use Permit for a greater amount of groundwater production authorization and the right to file a lawsuit or make any claim against the District for taking your property without just compensation.
- (e) If your application for a Historic Use Permit has been contested and is still contested one (1) year after the date of publication of the proposed Historic Use Permit, the District may limit the amount of water that you may produce until the contested case has concluded and the Board has made its final decision on your application. Such an interim production limitation shall be established by the Board only after an expedited interlocutory hearing before the Board to be initiated by motion of the General Manager.
- (f) The well owner of a well that was not required to be metered by the District prior to January 1, 2019, shall comply with the metering, groundwater production reporting, and fee payment requirements of these rules beginning on January 1, 2019.
