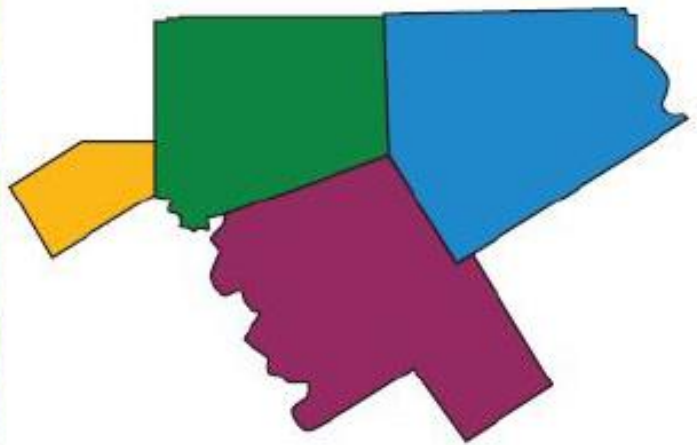

Groundwater Resources

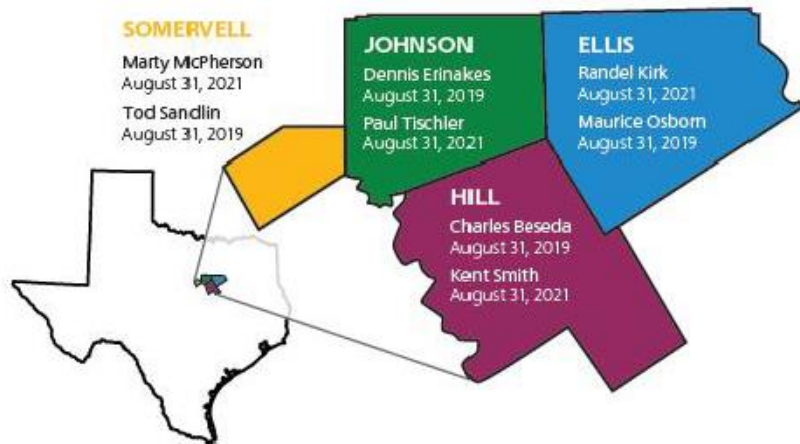
WHO WE ARE

The Prairielands Groundwater Conservation District conserves, protects and enhances groundwater resources in Ellis, Johnson, Hill and Somervell counties.

The District was created in response to a finding by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality that critical groundwater shortages were expected in the 4-county area over the next 25 years. Enabling legislation for the Prairielands GCD was passed in 2009.

DISTRICT STRUCTURE

The District has an 8-member board of directors, 2 from each county, who serve with no pay. They are appointed to 4-year terms by the commissioners' courts of each county.



WHAT WE DO

The District is operating through temporary rules while the science necessary to draft permanent rules is being developed. A management plan also is being developed.

District responsibilities include the following:

- Registering water wells
- Educating the public about groundwater and conservation issues
- Responding to concerns and questions from the public and local/state officials

WHAT WE DO (CONTINUED)

- Conducting scientific and technical research on the aquifers underlying the District, primarily the Trinity and Woodbine Aquifers
 - Collecting information on how much water is being pumped from the aquifers
 - Evaluating water level declines in aquifer layers
 - Performing aquifer characterization, mapping, and modeling studies
 - Building a database of water wells in the District
 - Evaluating projected growth in water demands and pressures on groundwater supplies to meet those demands
- Developing rules to conserve and manage groundwater resources

DISTRICT WATER EDUCATION TRAILER

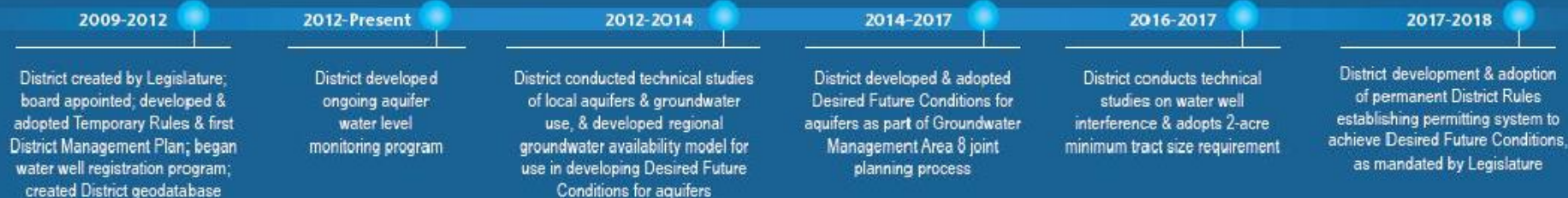
