NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all interested persons within the Prairielands Groundwater Conservation District, consisting of Ellis, Hill, Johnson, and Somervell counties: That the Board of Directors of the Prairielands Groundwater Conservation District (PGCD) will hold hearing(s) on applications for Operating Permits (OP) and/or Permit Amendments by the below listed parties on Monday, August 18, 2025, beginning at 9:00 AM at the District board room located at 208 Kimberly Drive, Cleburne, Texas 76031.

NOTICE is hereby specifically given to:

- 1. Spur Myrtle Creek Development, LP, for a proposed amendment to an Operating Permit (OP-25-084) to amend an existing well registration to substantially alter and increase the maximum designed capacity from 17 GPM to 195 GPM. The existing well (PGCD-003627, 32.36476100, -96.79851000) is located east of US 287 N off of Dartmoor Dr, Waxahachie in Ellis County; and for an increase in groundwater production in the amount of 62,601,830 gallons. OP-25-084-A not to exceed 63,163,600 gallons annually for 2025→2029; Non-Agricultural Irrigation (AK);
- 2. Rogers Group, Inc., for a proposed amendment to an Operating Permit (OP-22-034) for authorization to amend an existing well registration to substantially alter and increase its maximum designed capacity from 152 GPM to 300 GPM. The existing well (PGCD-001361, 32.23070700, -97.69423900) is located at 2673 County Road 412, Glen Rose in Somervell County (KB);
- 3. RiverOne LLC, for a proposed Operating Permit (OP-25-089) for authorization to drill a new well (PGCD-003704, 32.33548600, -96.69840900) to be located at 214 Shaw Rd, Ennis, in Ellis County; and to produce groundwater in an amount not to exceed 750,000 gallons annually for 2025→2029; Commercial Use (KB);
- 4. Nexus Land Holdings LLC, for a proposed amendment to an Operating Permit (OP-25-085) to extend special permit conditions as stated in the permit; and to increase groundwater production in the amount of 60,004,850 gallons annually from well (PGCD-00003626, 31.83710000, -96.76610000) located at 880 Hwy 171, Hubbard, in Hill County. OP-25-085-A not to exceed 77,862,050 gallons annually for 2025→2029; Industrial/Manufacturing (KB).

If approved, the permit(s) and/or permit amendments requested in the applications above would authorize the permit holder to withdraw groundwater from a water well according to the terms and conditions set forth in the permit. If you would like to contest an application for a permit or permit amendment, you must comply with District Rule 10.6 and either appear at the hearing or submit a written Request for Contested Case Hearing that complies with District Rule 10.6 and that must be received by the District prior to the date of the hearing.
